

THE PEOPLE OF CHICAGO'S COMMUNITY CONSENT DECREE

A coalition of grassroots community groups, organizations, families who have lost loved ones to police violence, survivors of police violence and terror have created the "Chicago Community Consent Decree".

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TAUNTS & HUMILIATION PROHIBITED

Officers are prohibited from using tactics that escalate an incident, including but not limited to taunting, humiliating or threatening individuals and the use of status or racist and/or identity based-slurs to include, but not limited to, intentionally mis-gendering any individual.

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SUPPORT FOR SEXUAL ASSAULT SURVIVORS

The City shall ensure that the Sexual Assault Nurse Practitioner Program contains training related to caring for sexual assault survivors who have been victimized by law enforcement; and ensure police sexual assault survivors are given immediate access to rape victim advocates, groups and other resources. Annual reporting of the total number and type of investigations related to excessive force, false arrest, illegal search, domestic violence, sexual misconduct, rape, sexual assault, coercion, by CPD must be made transparent.



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FIRST RESPONDER CARE

Officers are prohibited from interfering with emergency care being provided by first responders or anyone trained on the scene to provide such care.



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RESPECT FOR THE DECEASED

- Officers shall not handcuff the deceased.
- Officers shall shield the deceased from public view, while allowing family member access if requested.
- Officers shall remove the deceased from the scene as soon as the scene is documented in most all cases within an hour of the time of death.
- CPD shall facilitate the physical access of the deceased's family members and support system at any medical facility or morgue.

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TREATMENT OF SURVIVORS & FAMILIES

The City must fund and make available trauma-informed psycho-social support services for survivors of police violence and the families of both victims and survivors of police violence, for as long as necessary. These services shall be made available to individuals and families within 24 hours of an incident and shall, upon request, be made available to people in their arterial language.



In the event of a use of force that results in an individual sustaining any injury and/or resulting in death, the City shall provide, at no cost to the individual and/or his or her survivors medical examiners' reports, arrest reports, tactical response reports, investigations and all other documentation related to the incident.

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REKIA'S FUND

The City of Chicago shall establish a fund which shall be known as the "Rekia Fund for Families of Police Related Deaths." Each survivor of an individual who died as a result of CPD's actions under the circumstances listed below shall be paid \$5 million from the fund.

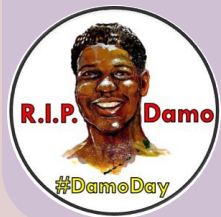


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TASERS

Officers are prohibited from using tasers in schools, on people who are handcuffed or restrained, children, the elderly, pregnant women, people in apparent medical distress or behavioral health crisis, and/or people who present as frail, low body mass, and/or sickly.

Officers are prohibited from tasing people in the head, neck, chest or groin



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STOP ACT

The #STOPAct drafted by We Charge Genocide, must be implemented in full requiring full mandatory data collection and transparency detailing the full breadth of stop & frisk in Chicago.
